The first African American

Catholic Church was opened in St. Paul, MN in 1888, in large part due to the efforts of Archbishop John Ireland who, according to the article in the MinnPost, vowed to "blot out the color line" "https://nbccongress.org/noteworthy-black-catholics

Lena Oliva Smith was the first African American

Women Attorney in Minnesota who also held her real estate license. Graduating from Northwestern College of Law in 1921. Mrs. Smith tremendously impacted civil rights, and social justice concerns here in Minnesota.
